603 North Street - Proposed window replacements (Thomas and Gwendolyn Bishop owner). House has a combination of 1 over 1 and multi-pane over one windows. There are storms on the outside. Motion made by John Schwemmer to approve replacement windows with Marvin Integrity windows. Dividers for simulated divided lights designed with mutton pattern of current sashes to identically match what is in home now and permanently adhered to the glass. This is for North, South and East elevations. Motion seconded by Cami Beiter. Motion approved unanimously.

532 N. Main Street – Comprehensive addition and renovations (Jeffrey and Sara Wyszynski, owner). John Schwemmer made motion to approve renovations per drawings dated April 2, 2016. The front and side exterior doors will be wood to match existing 6 panel doors. Front door knob will be changed to a latch. The garage doors will be wood carriage doors per the drawing. The existing exterior door surrounds and window brick molding will be removed, repaired and replaced in kind. The windows will be Marvin Integrity 6 over 6 windows with simulated divided lights. Lisa Sabbatino seconded. Motion approved unanimously.

227 N. Main Street – Proposed Dormitories including barn demolition (Suffield Academy) Patrick Booth and Marco Tommasini presented plans to demolition the barn at 227 N. Main Street and replace with two buildings for campus housing. The HDC requested that views of the project be provided from the gap angles between the existing houses on Main Street. Present options with smaller gable ended portions facing Main Street. The HDC also requested that the academy investigate options to save the barn or provide a plan that incorporates the barn in a moved location. Another suggested option was to incorporate elements of the barn design into the new proposed buildings.

Motion made and approved to adjourn meeting.
